The CLDF were there 24/7 to answer any questions my brother and sister in law had, and still support them to this day as Trinity struggles with numerous problems, including visible and non visible conditions, allergies and infections. Even a minor cold can lead to a hospital stay for treatment.

Trinity is a local celebrity and often appears in the papers, she celebrated her 10th birthday in August and she wanted to raise £500.00 to give to the CLDF. To help Trinity raise the money I decided to organise a competition.
